Items presented and discussed:

A letter of appreciation of support was read from the Mt Hood Corridor CPO

File No: ZO385-11-STC was presented and noted that hearing date is Feb. 16, 2012. This is in regards to a temporary care permit appeal. Input from neighbors is included.

Case file Nos. Z0375-11-STC (Appeal) (O'Neill) Request for temporary dwelling on Terra Fern Road. Information regarding this appeal was available.

File No. Z0503-11-HO regarding Home occupation permit to operate a one person chiropractic office on Ten Eyck Rd. This was approved, and information was available.

Jerry and Marge shared their experience attending the joint CPO meeting and reviewing the rules for conducting an effective meeting.

Solar Energy Information was shared. Oregon Cash Incentive programs are going on now until March 31, 2012. More information is available on growingsolar.org. Free assessments are available for solar system panels for home or ground mounts. Several community members have already taken advantage of this program. A workshop will be held at Sandy High School in March. Check the Sandy Post for upcoming dates.

Marge and Jerry shared information from the C4 community group meeting. Issues of concern include transportation and formulating a feasibility plan, keeping the shortfalls with the budget in mind. Prioritization of needs is a necessity. A common concern is the maintenance of roads, including safety needs and service routes. Carver Bridge congestion was discussed and noted that there are projects in the works at that area. On Feb 29, 2012, there will be an open house for the public in Oregon City.

Martha Schroeder, Candidate for Clackamas County Commissioner was present. She shared concerns for rural areas of road issues, budget concerns, social services delivery services, management of non-profit contracts, and her desire to see a shift in attrition. Her presence was appreciated.

There was an overwhelming concern to see more community involvement. Marge is working with a staff writer from the Sandy Post for an article regarding CPO's in a near future edition.
