

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

Notice is hereby given that the North Clackamas Parks & Recreation District, through its Board of County Commissioners acting as the Governing Body of the North Clackamas Parks & Recreation District, will receive sealed proposals per specifications until **5:00 PM August 13, 2009** to provide

Ultraviolet Sanitation for the Wave Pool at the North Clackamas Aquatic Park

No proposals will be received or considered after that time.

The North Clackamas Aquatic Park of the North Clackamas Parks & Recreation District intends to add Ultraviolet system to chlorine based system to enhance sanitation in its Wave pool system (187,000 gallons). The Aquatic Park is seeking qualified contractors to provide and install an ultraviolet based sanitation system. The installation will occur September 8-18, 2009 when the pool will be drained and closed for annual maintenance.

A mandatory pre-proposal conference is scheduled for Monday, August 3 at 9:00 AM. Interested contractors will meet at the Aquatic Park 7300 SE Harmony Road, Milwaukie to view the site.

The proposer must be currently registered and licensed with the Construction Contractors Board.

Proposal packets are available at Clackamas County Purchasing, Clackamas County Public Services Building, 2051 Kaen Road, Oregon City, OR 97045, phone 503-742-5444. Sealed proposals are to be sent to Lane Miller – Purchasing Manager at the Kaen Road address. Proposals will be opened in the Purchasing Department, located on the fourth floor of the Public Services Building, at the designated time.

This **is not** a public works contract subject to ORS 279.348 to 279.380 or the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 276a).

The North Clackamas Parks & Recreation District Board of County Commissioners reserves the right to reject any and all proposals not in compliance with all prescribed public bidding procedures and requirements, reject for good cause any and all proposals upon the finding that it is in the public interest to do so and waive any and all informalities in the public interest. In the award of the contract, the Board of County Commissioners will consider the element of time, will accept the proposal or proposals which in their estimation will best serve the interests of Clackamas County and will reserve the right to award the contract to the contractor whose proposal shall be best for the public good..
