Notice is hereby given that Clackamas County, through its Board of County Commissioners, will receive sealed responses per specifications until **4:00 P.M. Dec. 29, 2011** for a

ADULT RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

No responses will be received or considered after that time.

Since 1962, Clackamas County Behavioral Health has been providing public, non-profit community Behavioral Health Services to the residents of Clackamas County. Our mission is to create partnerships for recovery, independence, and growth for people with mental health and substance use issues.

Clackamas County's Behavioral Health Division is seeking a qualified provider organization to implement a two year pilot housing assistance and services program for Clackamas County residents in alcohol and drug recovery. The program has three components: substance abuse recovery, finding and retaining housing, and increasing income by connecting people with benefits and/or employment options.

Sealed qualifications are to be sent to Lane Miller – Purchasing Manager at the Kaen Road address. Qualifications will be opened in the Purchasing Department, located on the fourth floor of the Public Services Building, at the designated time.

Each response must contain a statement as to whether the vendor is a resident vendor, as defined in ORS 279A.120. This is not a public work contract subject to ORS 279C.800 to 279C.870 or the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 276a).

The Clackamas County Board of Commissioners reserves the right to reject any and all proposals not in compliance with all prescribed public bidding procedures and requirements, reject for good cause any and all proposals upon the finding that it is in the public interest to do so and waive any and all informalities in the public interest. In the award of the contract, the Board of County Commissioners will consider the element of time, will accept the proposal or proposals which in their estimation will best serve the interests of Clackamas County and will reserve the right to award the contract to the contractor whose proposal shall be best for the public good.
